If you do not have any images that you have taken, please research copyright free images online that you can print and bring with you to class. High quality images larger than 4" x 6" and 5" x 7" are recommended.

- Painting medium of your choice Liquin Original and Winsor and Newton Artists' Painting Medium are good options

- Brushes a variety of filberts, flats and rounds / both natural hog bristle and synthetic in various sizes *

Acrylic Painting Supplies

- 1 small sketchbook for thumbnails, studies and notes *
- · 1 graphite pencil (2B) and 1 kneaded eraser *
- 1 9" x 12" pad of Canson Canva-Paper *
- Pre-stretched canvas, canvas panel or primed wood panel (Ampersand Gessobord is a great brand)
- 1 palette You can purchase a Masterson Sta-Wet Premier Palette made specifically for acrylic
 paints, or make your own version using a metal butcher's tray (sold at Blick), a roll of white greaseproof
 paper, a small spray bottle, and a thin small cloth towel *
- 1 palette knife *
- Several large plastic cups for holding water and brushes large cottage cheese or yogurt containers work well *
- · Painting medium of your choice I recommend Liquitex Slow-Dri Blending Fluid Medium *
- 1 roll of artists' tape *
- 1 small spray water bottle *
- Brushes a variety of synthetic filberts, flats and rounds in various sizes *

- Kneaded eraser *
- 1 Mars white plastic eraser and 1 Tuff Stuff eraser pen *
- Mixed pack of blending stumps (tortillons) *
- · Straight edge ruler *
- · Pencil sharpener *
- One roll of artist tape *
- 1 small sketchbook for thumbnails and notes *
- 1 pad of perforated drawing paper for graphite (18" x 24" minimum) *
