

Some classes have specific requirements (prerequisites) that must be met before participating. Following these requirements is best for the students and instructors, alike.

Introductory Level

For students with no art experience

Class work includes learning basic art terms and studio fundamentals while exploring materials and mediums in a comfortable, non-threatening environment.

Level 1

For the beginner student with some art background, but still needing instruction in basic art skills and techniques.

Level 2

For the student who has already acquired basic knowledge of art terms, fundamentals and skills, but still wants further instruction to improve technique and begin discovering their own style.

Level 3


For the advanced student who requires more challenging instruction and encouragement to develop a unique artist expression and direction.

Level 4+

For the advanced student who has done extensive exploration of their own media of choice, and desires more in depth study and critiques from their instructor and fellow advanced level students.

BBAC offers the service of purchasing additional clay (one bag at a time) and can be purchased at the beginning of Independent Studio time.







Drawing Foundations is based on providing students a solid foundation in drawing fundamentals through an exploration of traditional media and techniques. Students will learn about line, shape, composition, perspective, light & shadow and how to translate a three-dimensional visual into a two-dimensional drawing through observation and imagination. Students will learn to understand the potential of drawing in itself, as well as apply this knowledge to other media.

Drawing: The Art & Skill of Drawing 1

Instructor: Armin Mersmann

The Art and Skill of Drawing is designed with the beginner in mind, but intermediate students will get a lot of new information as well. This is an essential class for those who want to draw, and is a great starting point for those who would like to move into other media such as painting, photography, sculpture and digital art. Students will learn the art of observation, (the first component in learning how to draw) and be introduced to drawing fundamentals: line, shape, volume, proportion, space, shading, value, and sight measuring. These techniques will be applied to black and white media, with primary concentration on graphite. Students will receive individual attention no matter what their skill level.

ArtBridge

This program is designed to benefit talented, motivated high school art students who come from underserved schools. Intensive art instruction and mentoring are provided in preparation for college entry. A typical teen spends one to three years at the BBAC, completing core curriculum and elective art classes, interning with an artist or instructor, and completing a digital portfolio for college applications.

ArtBridge is free for participants, who are recommended by their teachers or principals. While there is intermittent support from foundations, the BBAC remains committed to maintaining this important program with or without outside funding.

ArtBridge in Detroit

Since 2016, the BBAC has been providing a weekly art curriculum including an instructor and materials plus an after-school program to a Detroit middle school — all at no charge to the school or students. For six years prior to our arrival, the school had no art programming.

ArtBridge in Detroit is supported in part by:









The Art of Caregiving[®]

The needs of caregivers — whether professional or family members — are often overlooked.

Our program — FREE OF CHARGE is designed to provide an outlet with creative relief from the daily routine. Sessions include networking, informal discussion, and different art projects. No experience is required.

We send participants home with a kit containing supplies and materials reflecting that day's art session. Caregivers can choose to share this with the person they care for or use it themselves.

Meet Me @ the BBAC

Art-looking and art-making experiences for individuals with early and mid-stage Alzheimer's or dementia are offered for groups from human service agencies throughout the region as well as individuals still living at home.

In a typical session, we spend about a half-hour looking at and talking about artwork in a current BBAC exhibit, then everyone moves to the art studio to create their own artwork based on what we've just seen. Each person leaves with their completed project.

(Participation fees are nominal.)

The BBAC, in partnership with human service agencies, provides art instruction for groups of individuals with a range of cognitive, physical, and/or emotional challenges.

Partners have included FAR, Oakland County Children's Village, Angel's Place, and Friendship Club.

Studio 1[®], which began in 2008 when our vision of "art for all" was just emerging, remains a driving force behind our ArtAccess offerings.
