

ARTIST BIO: S. Lee Robinson (Sheri Lee Robinson) is an American Abstract/Surrealist painter living and working in Detroit, MI. After graduating from the San Francisco Art Institute in 1989 with a BFA in Painting, she embarked on a long, prolific career that has landed her compelling work into the hands of art collectors worldwide.

ARTIST STATEMENT: Larger than life.

I make large format, abstract paintings in oil, ink and acrylic. I also sometimes make tiny paintings with big things to say. My work is eclectic and I never know what will emerge. Often it is otherworldly and completely unexpected but always much larger than this life. The process is both simple and terrifying as I approach the canvas and wait for the story to be told. My job is to capture the story and lie it down on the canvas. This approach is automatic and seems to invite direct access to buried, archetypal stories from our world and beyond. I just have to HOLD ON for the ride that follows and do my job as the painter. Sometimes the paintings take years, or sometimes only hours to complete. My acceptance of this process and its results have been a challenge for me as the story isn't always pretty and the darkness important and real. I am not sure why I was chosen for this job, but chose me it did.

I do feel that my work provides wonder and energetic healing to those who come in contact with it. Words often escape me but my paintings never fail to say what needs to be said.

Level 4+


For the advanced student who has done extensive exploration of their own media of choice, and desires more in depth study and critiques from their instructor and fellow advanced level students.



New Class & Instructor!

Book Arts:

The Structure of the Visual Book

Instructor: Gwendolyn English

In this course, we will examine the structure of the visual book by exploring a historical sampling of traditional and sculptural book bindings. We will discuss some history of bookbinding and look at slides of historical and contemporary books for contextualization and inspiration. In the first class, students will make a 4-hole Japanese Stab bound "text book" of the various book bindings we will create weekly in the first half of the course. Some bindings include Japanese Account Books, Pamphlet Bindings, Accordion Fold Books, Long Stitch Binding, and Coptic Bound

In the second half of the course, I will help students design a personal book project using one or more of the techniques we studied earlier. Emphasis will be on following a line of inquiry with personal significance to the participant and creating a traditional or sculptural book to support the student's creative vision.

All books, excluding the final project, are covered by the materials fee.

Japanese Calligraphy: All Levels

Instructor: Kyoko Fujii

Experience and discover the timeless beauty of Japanese calligraphy (Shodo), a traditional art form that combines penmanship with artistic expression. Using brushes and ink, you can create a wide range of lines, thicknesses, and gradations, from simple strokes to complex characters. This class covers from the basics to advanced techniques, allowing you to explore your creativity and connect with the essence of each character. This course offers a unique opportunity to express yourself through the beauty of Shodo.

On the first day of class, please bring your calligraphy tools if you have them — or if not, the instructor will share her materials. We will discuss materials in class to bring for week two.

The BBAC Ceramic Arts Department

BBAC offers students of all levels, ages and abilities numerous opportunities to learn about ceramic arts and interact with other ceramic artists in the community. Whether you are a novice or advanced student, this is the place to learn, create and grow!

Ceramics Department Studio Policies

Ceramics classes, independent studios and open studios are intended to further the education experience for your creative growth. BBAC ceramics studio may not be used as a production studio.

The BBAC reserves the right to turn away firing a student's work if:

- Multiples of objects are made from the same student within a semester and are clearly a production of the same or very similar pieces.
- A student keeps sending the same piece back to be glaze fired more than 2 times.
- A student makes pieces outside of the BBAC (using additional clay sold outside BBAC) and brings them to BBAC to be glazed and/ or fired because the student is registered in a class.
- A student brings in another person(s) pieces from outside of BBAC to be glazed and/ or fired in the BBAC studio.

Only work made at BBAC using clay from BBAC, can be glazed and fired at BBAC.

Purchasing Clay at the BBAC

One 25 lb. bag of clay is included with your ceramics class. Currently registered students can purchase additional clay during their regular class time through the instructor.

- Limit is three, 25 lb. bags per term.
- Each 25 lb. bag of Wheat Stone is \$20.
- Each 25 lb. bag of Porcelain is \$22.

How can the process of scale, surface and form blend to strengthen ideas? In this class, students will investigate these elements to formulate their own unique bodies of work. We will experiment using the wheel as a tool, combining slabs, press molds, and extruded components to further alter the sculptures. After constructing a foundation, we will focus on glaze surfacing/cold working. Students will have the opportunity to utilize different glazing processes and concepts. We will also cover helpful repair tricks that may add another layer of interest. Get ready to think outside of the box and reconstruct contemporary concepts!




Drawing: Figure & Portrait in Pastel


Students will draw from live models in poses of varying length that emphasize anatomical clarity of form. A variety of media will be used.

ArtBridge

This program is designed to benefit talented, motivated high school art students who come from underserved schools. Intensive art instruction and mentoring are provided in preparation for college entry. A typical teen spends one to three years at the BBAC, completing core curriculum and elective art classes, interning with an artist or instructor, and completing a digital portfolio for college applications.

ArtBridge is free for participants, who are recommended by their teachers or principals. While there is intermittent support from foundations, the BBAC remains committed to maintaining this important program with or without outside funding.

ArtBridge in Detroit

Since 2016, the BBAC has been providing a weekly art curriculum including an instructor and materials plus an after-school program to a Detroit middle school — all at no charge to the school or students. For six years prior to our arrival, the school had no art programming. We continue our outreach with a new partnership with Detroit Public Schools.

The Art of Caregiving®

The needs of caregivers — whether professional or family members — are often overlooked.

Our program — FREE OF CHARGE — is designed to provide an outlet with creative relief from the daily routine. Sessions include networking, informal discussion, and different art projects. No experience is required.

We send participants home with a kit containing supplies and materials reflecting that day's art session. Caregivers can choose to share this with the person they care for or use it themselves.

Meet Me @ the BBAC

Art-looking and art-making experiences for individuals with early and mid-stage Alzheimer's or dementia are offered for groups from human service agencies throughout the region as well as individuals still living at home.

In a typical session, we spend about a half-hour looking at and talking about artwork in a current BBAC exhibit, then everyone moves to the art studio to create their own artwork based on what we've just seen. Each person leaves with their completed project.

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

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
