Artist Statement:

I have been painting and drawing since childhood. In Europe I learned how to draw and paint like the old masters. In the USA I was introduced to contemporary methods and theory, earning my MFA in painting and drawing. In my works I am juxtaposing the realistic and the dreamlike, integrating contrasting criteria: objective and subjective expression.

My works have been shown in museums, colleges, universities and galleries.

Living in Northern Michigan for about 12 years drew me into the beauty and serenity of the surroundings. I am mostly painting special places where I find peace. I am showing this through the materials and techniques of art; what I feel and how important nature is to me.

I hope viewers feel the same and preserve everything that Mother Nature has to offer.

I have been teaching art classes for kids and adults for twenty years in various organizations. Some of them include CMU, MMCC, Midland Center for the Arts, Crooked Tree Art Center, Glen Arbor Art Center, Northwestern Michigan College, and Traverse City Area Public Schools.

Level 1

For the beginner student with some art background, but still needing instruction in basic art skills and techniques.

Level 2

For the student who has already acquired basic knowledge of art terms, fundamentals and skills, but still wants further instruction to improve technique and begin discovering their own style.

Level 3

For the advanced student who requires more challenging instruction and encouragement to develop a unique artist expression and direction.

Level 4+

For the advanced student who has done extensive exploration of their own media of choice, and desires more in depth study and critiques from their instructor and fellow advanced level students.



The BBAC Ceramic Arts Department

BBAC offers students of all levels, ages and abilities numerous opportunities to learn about ceramic arts and interact with other ceramic artists in the community. Whether you are a novice or advanced student, this is the place to learn, create and grow!

Ceramics Department Studio Policies

BBAC Ceramics classes and open studio times for registered students are intended to further the education experience for creative growth. Everyone must follow studio safety precautions and scheduling policies. All participants must be respectful of others sharing the studio.

- Only current student work made at BBAC using clay from BBAC, can be glazed and fired at BBAC.

BBAC ceramics studio may not be used as a production studio.

The BBAC reserves the right to turn away firing a student's work if:

- Multiples of objects are made from the same student within a semester and are clearly a production of the same or very similar pieces.
- The work is created outside of the BBAC and brought into the BBAC to be glazed, fired or stored.
- The same piece is sent back to be fired more than two times.

Purchasing Clay at the BBAC

One 25 lb. bag of clay is included with your ceramics class. Currently registered students can purchase additional clay during their regular class time through the instructor.

- Limit is two (2) additional bags per term if clay inventory allows.
- Each 25 lb. bag of Wheat Stone is \$21.
- Each 25 lb. bag of Porcelain is \$24.

When the term *iPhoneography* was first coined, it simply meant “the art of taking pictures with Apple’s iPhone.” While iPhones are preferred (iPhone 11 or higher recommended), other smartphones may also be used. We will cover the basics of the iPhone camera and begin working with apps to create images that rival those from DSLR cameras. But this is not a traditional photography class. Instead, the focus is on exploring creativity through the iPhone—asking not how do I take a better picture, but how can I make a more expressive and imaginative image? “What if” will be the mantra. We will explore app stacking, photo collage, and image manipulation techniques, learning how to distort, alter, and transform photographs. The results may appear surreal, abstract, fantastical, or even antique. The possibilities are virtually endless.

iPhoneography emphasizes not capturing a single decisive moment but building an image through a creative process that closely resembles painting and collage, rather than conventional photography.

Expressions in Contour Drawing Workshop

Contour drawing is an essential technique in art because it provides a strong foundation for both drawing and painting. It is a method in which the artist outlines the shape, structure, and mass of a subject. The primary details and features are defined, while smaller details and value transitions are intentionally omitted.

In contour drawing, the artist focuses on accurately representing the edges and boundaries of forms—their “contours”—without relying on shading to create volume or depth. Instead, expression and structure are achieved through line quality.

The primary goal of this workshop is to explore the expressive potential of line by using thick, thin, lost, and found lines to describe form, space, and movement. In short, a single line can tell a story. There are five types of contour drawing; in this ten-hour, two-day class, you will work with blind contour, closed contour, and, if there is time, open contour drawings. You will also see sample of cross-contour and shaded contour drawings.


The camp will be held from August 10, 2026 through August 14, 2026, — from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm at the BBAC.

ArtBridge

This program is designed to benefit talented, motivated high school art students who come from underserved schools. Intensive art instruction and mentoring are provided in preparation for college entry. A typical teen spends one to three years at the BBAC, completing core curriculum and elective art classes, interning with an artist or instructor, and completing a digital portfolio for college applications.

ArtBridge is free for participants, who are recommended by their teachers or principals. While there is intermittent support from foundations, the BBAC remains committed to maintaining this important program with or without outside funding.

ArtBridge in Detroit

Since 2016, the BBAC has been providing a weekly art curriculum including an instructor and materials plus an after-school program to a Detroit middle school — all at no charge to the school or students. For six years prior to our arrival, the school had no art programming. We continue our outreach with a new partnership with Detroit Public Schools.

The Art of Caregiving®

The needs of caregivers — whether professional or family members — are often overlooked.

Our program — FREE OF CHARGE — is designed to provide an outlet with creative relief from the daily routine. Sessions include networking, informal discussion, and different art projects. No experience is required.

We send participants home with a kit containing supplies and materials reflecting that day's art session. Caregivers can choose to share this with the person they care for or use it themselves.



Meet Me @ the BBAC

Art-looking and art-making experiences for individuals with early and mid-stage Alzheimer's or dementia are offered for groups from human service agencies throughout the region as well as individuals still living at home.

In a typical session, we spend about a half-hour looking at and talking about artwork in a current BBAC exhibit, then everyone moves to the art studio to create their own artwork based on what we've just seen. Each person leaves with their completed project.


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
